The Northeast Entrepreneur Fund was conceived in the mid 1980's, in the wake of a devastating recession that caused widespread job loss in northeastern Minnesota and northwestern Wisconsin. The goal was to promote economic self-sufficiency in a region long dependent on large iron mining and timber companies by helping individuals start their own businesses. Today, the Northeast Entrepreneur Fund's mission is to promote the entrepreneurial spirit and create economic wealth and diversity. Since its founding in 1989, the Fund has helped to create more than 1,000 businesses and 2,500 jobs throughout its eleven-county service area, and has become a national leader in microenterprise and small business development. The Fund's products and services include small business loans, business planning services and technical assistance, and its Women's Business Network.

## Success Story: Carol Willoughby, Duluth, MN

In 1989, when her husband's job was in decline, Carol Willoughby started a sign-making business in her home. With financing and technical assistance from the Northeast Entrepreneur Fund, she transformed the small company, Let the Whole World Know, into a thriving enterprise that serves some of the region's largest organizations, and has launched a second business, Window Doodads. "The Northeast Entrepreneur Fund provided technical training and also gave me the confidence to actually think I could do it. I probably wouldn't be in business without them," Carol said.
